Read, Reflect and Pray from Heather Castle Lent 1.

We begin to prepare for Easter and our thoughts centre on the Journey Christ took to the Cross for us . . . Here we look at the beginning and at our response.

Read:

Colossians 1 v 15 - 20 'The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in Him all things were created: things in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers or rulers or authorities; all things have been created through Him and for Him. He is before all things and in Him all things hold together. And He is the head of the body, the church; He is the beginning and the firstborn from among the dead, so that in everything He might have the supremacy. For God was pleased to have all His fullness dwell in Him, and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through His blood shed on the cross'.

John 1 v 1 - 3 'In the beginning was the Word (= Jesus) and the Word was with God and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through Him all things were made; without Him nothing was made that has been made'.

And in Revelation 13 v 8 Jesus is referred to as 'the Lamb who was slain from the creation of the world'.

Reflect: God has always been triune, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The whole of God was active in the creation of the universe and all of God has been active ever since. Even before mankind existed God knew that the people He would create with the freedom to make choices would mess things up, both for themselves and for the world around us and that these wrong choices would alienate us from God, so we would need a Saviour to break down the barrier of sin and restore our relationship with God. So Jesus was to be that Saviour, planned from the beginning of time, the 'Lamb slain from the creation of the world'. I acknowledge that what Christ did on the cross made salvation available to all but I must recognise my personal need of a Saviour to be able to claim His forgiveness for myself. Have I reached that point in my life? Do I know that I am redeemed? If so, praise God and move forward . . . ever onward with Him. If not, wouldn't this Lent be the perfect time to come to Him in faith and accept what Christ did for me on the Cross? What about my family and friends? Am I concerned for their spiritual welfare and, if so, is God counting on me to gently lead them to Him?

Pray: 'Nothing in my hand I bring, Helpless to Thy cross I cling . . . '
Be honest with God. Thank Him for your salvation and ask Him to help you to work it out in your daily life and in your concern for others or confess to Him your need of a Saviour and accept for yourself what He made available for all who will turn to Him in penitence and faith.
